The Board of Trustees approved the names of the district's newest elementary schools, **Tuscany Heights** and **Cibolo Green**.

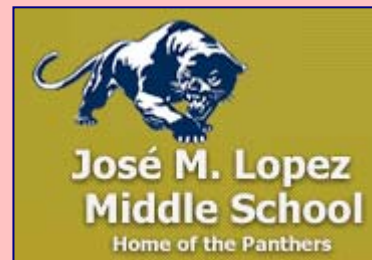


NEISD hosted its annual Unity Conference for more than 175 high school students, where they learned about diversity and tolerance in order to promote a safe and welcoming school climate.
