

SPECIAL INFORMATION

1. **Students enrolling in Pre-AP classes will be required to return a commitment form signed by both the parent and the student. Pre-AP classes are available to all students willing to commit to a more rigorous and challenging course of study.**
2. Students taking Algebra I in middle school may receive high school credit for these courses. Students earning a grade of less than 70 in Algebra will need to retake this course in 9th grade. These students will be required to meet the NEISD guidelines for high school graduation.
3. The 8th grade Spanish IB is the second part of a two-year program. Students must have successfully completed Spanish IA in the seventh grade to enroll in Spanish IB. Successful completion of Spanish IA and IB will give the student one credit for Spanish I at the high school level.
4. For a student to be screened as a candidate for the National Junior Honor Society, the academic and conduct record for grades 6, 7 and the first semester of grade 8 will be used as part of the process.
5. Students may be assigned to a class designed to reinforce TAKS skills in lieu of an elective at any time during the school year.
6. Students wishing to be in debate must fill out an application and receive a recommendation from Mrs. Desbrow in room 431.
7. Office / Teacher Aide information
The following criteria have been established for Office Aide/Teacher Aide applicants.
 - *No record of serious disciplinary problems and/or a “U” in conduct in the seventh grade.
 - *Good attendance record
 - *No semester grade below a 70 in the seventh grade
 - *Presentable personal appearance, complies with standard attire policy
 - *Positive attitude and willingness to learn
 - * If you would like to be a student aide, you must obtain an application from the counseling office and hand it in with your choice sheet.(Selection, assignment, and approval of the students for student aide positions will be determined by the administrative staff. NO EXCEPTIONS CAN BE MADE.)
