

## Overview of Class Rank for NEISD Students

All courses that count for graduation will count.

Students may rank courses (up to 26 credits) taken in high school that count toward graduation.

### Excluded Courses:

Those taken

- \* More than once,
- \* In evening school,
- \* In middle school,
- \* For pass/fail credit,
- \* By correspondence,
- \* Through credit by exam,
- \* During summer foreign study, or
- \* With an ARD exemption

Weighted rank factors are used to calculate the weighted grade for each course.

### Weighted Rank Factors:

Advanced Placement, GT-AP, & Dual Credi	1.29
Pre-Advance Placement, Honors, GT-Non-AP & Dual Credit Non-AP	1.15
Regular	1.00
Content Modified	0.90

A weighted cumulative grade point average is used for rank.

Each student's weighted cumulative grade point average is used to assign a rank position.

Preliminary, unofficial rank is issued after the second and fourth semesters.

Official rank is issued after the sixth, the seventh and the seven and one-half semesters.

Honor Graduates are designated using the student's overall weighted grade point average.

Students must be on the Recommended or Distinguished Achievement Plans to be an honor graduate.
