## **TAP Guidelines/Contract**

Any NEISD student wanting to enroll in the Electrical Systems Technology (**TAP**) on the Douglas MacArthur High School Campus that is willing to get involved in the study of electricity and participate in SkillsUSA activities may apply. The following criteria are established to ensure that all transfer students, and home campus students satisfy the requirements. Students that attend MacArthur on School Choice and select the Electrical System Technology program or are placed by their counselor must also abide by all the following guidelines.

- 1.) The student must pass all core classes with a 70 GPA or better.
- 2.) The student must maintain an approved course of study provided by the Electrical Systems Technology Technical Apprenticeship Program and maintain a grade point average of 75 or better in that electrical class.
- 3.) The student must maintain satisfactory conduct in all classes and school activities.
- 4.) The student must maintain good attendance in all classes
- 5.) The student must be a paid member of SkillsUSA in good standing throughout the entire school year.
- 6.) The student status will be reviewed each semester.
- 7.) The student may be removed at any time for any violation of the criteria above.
- 8.) The parent must be willing to attend program functions and meetings.

These guidelines are designed to maintain the progress of the student and the integrity of the Technical Apprenticeship Program.
