ACCREDITATION

James Madison is fully accredited by the Texas Education Agency.

COMPOSITION

Madison is a comprehensive high school, grades 9-12, with 3,400 plus students - currently the largest student body in the North East Independent School District. From 1994-95 through 2009-10 school years, the school followed an A/B block schedule. The typical student schedule consisted of eight classes with each class period lasting 90 minutes and meeting every other day. Beginning in 2010-11 the school follows a 7 period day with each class period lasting 50 minutes. On both types of schedules each semester consists of 18 weeks and two nine week reporting periods.

RECOGNITION

NATIONAL: In May 2000, James Madison High School was awarded "National Blue Ribbon School" by the United States Department of Education. Madison High School is noted as "a big campus with a small campus atmosphere where the community spirit is really special." **STATE:** As part of the 2000 Texas Accountability Rating Category, Madison High School has been selected as one of 2,400 (out of 6,540) Texas schools to achieve **Academically Recognized** status for the years 2002-2004 and 2009 and **Academically Acceptable** for the years 2005-2008.

HISTORY/COMMUNITY

Established in 1976, James Madison graduated its first senior class in 1980. Throughout the years, Madison has had numerous National Merit Scholars. The campus is located in the northeast suburban area of San Antonio, Texas, the seventh largest metropolitan area in the United States with a population of over one million people. The socio-economic level of the community is a mixture of the middle class spectrum, and the student population is ethnically diverse.

Students are encouraged to complete the Recommended or Distinguished Achievement Program with additional requirements. Graduates completing these programs are named Texas Scholars. Graduates must also demonstrate mastery of the EXIT Level TAKS (Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills) Test as required by the State of Texas.

CURRICULUM

The school provides a multilevel curriculum in which all content areas are closely coordinated with mandated Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills. Gifted/Talented, Advanced Placement, Dual Credit, Pre-Advanced Placement, and Honors courses are offered in various subjects. Pre-Advanced Placement courses are offered in English, math, science, social studies, foreign language, and computer science. Science electives such as Anatomy and Physiology, and Health Science Technology I and II are offered and taught by certified science teachers. French, German, Latin, Japanese, Mandarin Chinese, Sign Language, and Spanish are available. Programs such as Special Education and ELL are available to meet the needs of eligible students. In addition to the district's sole agriculture program, Madison offers a vast array of career and technical courses as well as cooperative work programs.
