As the Reagan counseling staff receives updated materials on scholarships and college admissions, we will share this information with you through the senior bulletin.

By now, all seniors should have received an updated copy of their transcript in the mail. This transcript includes your six semester class rank and cumulative grade average. Please check your transcript thoroughly; if you notice any errors, **see your counselor immediately!**

As you begin the college application process, please remember to request a transcript at least one week before it needs to be sent, request letters of recommendation two weeks before they need to be sent, and return completed scholarship applications at least one week before the postmark deadline. Plan ahead, and let us know if you have questions!

THEA Exam

All public and some private universities in the state of Texas require the **THEA** (Texas Higher Education Assessment) for placement purposes. This test must be taken before a student enrolls in classes. **Entering freshmen may be exempt from taking the THEA if they meet at least one of the following standards:**

1. Earn an SAT I total score of 1070 or more, with a score of at least 500 each on the verbal and math portions of the test
2. Earn an ACT composite score of 23 or more, with a score of at least 19 each on the English and math portions of the test
3. Earn an Exit level TAKS (11th grade) score of at least 2200 on the English Language with at least a “3” on the writing subsection **and** at least a 2200 on the Mathematics section

When should students register? Students may register at anytime but it is recommended that they register during their junior year. The Eligibility Center will evaluate a student’s academic credentials once the following information has been received, and the student has had their status requested by an

- NCAA member institution;
- Completed online registration;
- Fee payment;
- SAT OR ACT test score on file from the respective testing agency;
- Transcript(s) from all schools or programs attended.

Official Test Scores

Test scores must be reported directly to the Eligibility Center from the ACT or SAT companies. Test scores will not be taken off transcript or from a student score report. When a student registers for the SAT or ACT, remind them to include the Eligibility Center code of 9999 so the test comes directly to the Eligibility Center at no extra charge. Remember that if a student takes the SAT or ACT multiple times, NCAA rules require that all scores must be reported to the Eligibility Center.

The Texas Common Application

All public universities in the state of Texas accept the Texas Common Application for Freshman Admission. Paper copies of this application are available in the Counseling Career Center; however, all universities prefer that students apply online at www.applytexas.org.

Ordering a Transcript

When a student applies to a university, he or she must also send an official transcript. This transcript must be sent directly from Reagan to the university. Your transcript is a record of all courses taken in high school and all semester grades received in those courses. Your class rank and high school grade average also appear on your transcript.

Transcripts may be ordered from Mrs. Miller in the Counseling Office. The cost is \$5.00 per transcript (the first official transcript sent is free). Transcripts that are needed for scholarship applications are free. Mrs. Miller must have a **minimum of 5 days'** notice before sending a transcript. Transcripts cannot be faxed or mailed via overnight services. Official copies of transcripts **cannot** be given to students or to parents to be delivered to another school or individual. **PLAN AHEAD SO THAT YOUR TRANSCRIPTS WILL ARRIVE BY THE PUBLISHED DEADLINE.**

ACT/SAT test scores must be requested from the testing agency by the student for college admission or scholarship. We do not print ACT/SAT scores on your transcript.

You must have a release form on file in the Counseling Office to order a transcript!!!

FINANCIAL RESOURCES AVAILABLE

Many of the following programs and services require students to establish their eligibility, or financial need, by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA forms must be completed online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. These forms can only be completed once your parents' 2010 income tax returns have been completed.

- **Scholarships** are available to those who show evidence of outstanding academic performance. Some scholarships may also require that you show financial aid eligibility.
- **Grants**, like scholarships, do not have to be repaid. The demand for grants is great, and there is limited funding available. Therefore, students with the highest financial aid eligibility are likely to receive this type of award.
- **Employment** through the federal or state Work Study Program is available to students who show financial aid eligibility and who want to work part-time during the academic year. Most employment opportunities are on campus.
- **Long Term Student Loans** are available at low interest rates through the Federal Family Educational Loan programs. Some loans do not accrue interest, and none require repayment until you have been out of school for six months. Remember that loans must be repaid.

Each college or university has a Financial Aid/Scholarship Office. Contact your university for assistance with scholarships, grants, employment and loan opportunities.

THE PIPER FOUNDATION prints a booklet entitled the **Compendium**. This book lists all Texas colleges, their entrance requirements, deadlines, tuition, room and board costs and financial aid available. Additionally, the book contains an extensive listing of general scholarships. The Compendium will be available in the Career Center in September and is also available via the web at www.window.state.tx.us/scholars/mspmain.html.

ATTENTION: Many scholarships require transcripts or letters of recommendation. Order your transcripts well before the scholarship deadline!!



Scholarship forms must be complete and to Mrs. Miller at least one week before the mailing deadline if they require a transcript and at least two weeks before the mailing deadline if your counselor must write a letter of recommendation.

Scholarship applications and/or transcript requests brought to the Counseling Office on the day they are to be mailed will not be processed on time. DO YOUR PART AND PLAN AHEAD!!!

Lastly, if your counselor will be writing letters of recommendation for you, please bring a copy of your resume and your completed senior questionnaire to the Counseling Office. Questionnaires are available in the Counseling Career Center.
