## SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Claudia Taylor “Lady Bird” Johnson is named in honor of the wife of the 36th President, Lyndon Baines Johnson. The wildflower theme of the school is a testament to the legacy of Lady Bird. Johnson is the newest comprehensive, 6A high school in the North East Independent School District, which is located in San Antonio, the seventh largest city in the U.S. Opened in August 2008, Johnson has an enrollment of approximately 3200 in grades 9 -12.

Each semester consists of two nine week grading periods. Students can take up to 7 classes and have opportunity to earn 7.0 credits per year.

## CURRICULUM

Our faculty provides a multi-level curriculum, including Advanced Placement, Gifted/Talented, Honors, regular, and developmental courses that give students the opportunity to pursue unique programs that meet their individual needs. In addition to academics, a wide variety of extracurricular activities are available to our students in the areas of Athletics, Band, Choir, Dance Spirit Groups, Debate, Journalism, Orchestra, ROTC, Theatre and Visual Arts.

Johnson offers 36 AP and 32 Honors courses in the areas of English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language, Fine Arts, and Computer Science. A variety of Career & Technical courses are offered in the areas of Health Science, Human Services, Business, Technology, Engineering, and Criminal Justice. There are also off-campus opportunities for cooperative work programs, clinical rotations, practicums in education, and a wide variety of programs at NEISD Career & Technical Education Center (CTEC).

Johnson, in partnership with San Antonio College, offers dual credit in English, Biology, College Algebra, US History, Spanish Language, and Art Appreciation. There are also dual credit opportunities in Accounting and Business Management. Johnson also offers a dual enrollment program with The University of Texas at Austin, titled OnRamps, in the areas of Pre-Calculus, Physics I, and Physics II.

## ACCREDITATION

Johnson High School is accredited by the Texas Education Agency and is a member of the College Board. Johnson High School was named as a **Texas Exemplary School** for the 2011- 2012 school year.

The Class of 2020 had 179 Summa Cum Laude graduates, 105 Magna Cum Laude graduates and 145 Cum Laude graduates.

Ninety-three percent of Johnson High School graduates were accepted to a post secondary institution: 64% planned to attend a 4-year institution and 29% planned to attend a 2-year program; 3% planned to enlist in the armed forces.

The Class of 2020 was offered over \$21,897,000 in scholarships.

The 2020 Senior Class had 1 National Merit Finalist, 14 National Merit Commended Scholars, and 17 National Hispanic Scholars.

Students will choose one of five **Endorsement** options: Multidisciplinary Studies, STEM, Business and Industry, Public Services, or Arts and Humanities. Each endorsement requires specific courses, usually 4-5 credits in a concentrated area.

Students may also earn a **Performance Acknowledgment** through Dual Credit, Bilingualism/Biliteracy, Languages Other Than English, Advanced Placement, PSAT/SAT/ACT, or a Business Certification or License.

## CLASS RANKING

Required graduation courses, up to a maximum of 26 credits, taken in grades 9-12 through the end of the seventh semester, will be used to calculate Class Rank. *The following courses are excluded from rank: courses taken more than once, in middle school, for pass/fail credit, through credit by exam, during summer foreign study, or with an ARD exemption.*

Weighted rank factors are used to calculate the rank points for each course:

- Advanced Placement (AP): 1.29
- Honors, Pre-AP, non-AP Dual Credit & GT: 1.15
- Regular: 1.00

Each student's weighted cumulative average of required classes is used to assign a rank position. A preliminary, unofficial rank is issued after the second and fourth semesters. Students' official rank is issued after the sixth and seventh semesters. Honor graduates are designated by using the student's 7th semester overall cumulative weighted grade point average. Students must be on the Foundation High School Program-Distinguished Level of Achievement to be an honor graduate.
