Air Rifle; Our precision and sporter team recently competed in the Bexar County JROTC Air Rifle Championships. Precision Team took First Place (beating all other district teams), with a team score of 2266 (a perfect score is 2400). Leading the team was Isabella Rios with a individual score of 577 with 41 bullseyes, followed by Bella Gamez with a 576, Bradley Knight with a 566, and Michael Winslow with a 547. Also of note was Isabella LaHaye who shot a 571.

Sporter Team took 3rd place finishing behind Roosevelt in 1st place and Smithson Valley in 2nd place. We shot a team score of 2003. Leading the team was Paul Mankewitz with a 520, Jacob Saldana with a 509, Samantha Lippolis with a 494, and Ian Zinsmeister with a 480. Also Dexter Williams who shoot a 466.

At the Roosevelt Roughrider Cup Match our precision team took 1st place again with a score of 2293, and our Sporter team also took 1st place with a score of 2038.

This is our last week before our Precision team travels to Anniston Alabama for the Army JROTC Service Championships. This is only the fourth time a Johnson team has qualified for the Service Championships. If we finish in the top five the team will qualify to go to the National JROTC Championships. Good luck Jags!
