All local agencies were afforded an opportunity to be listed in this brochure. Only those that applied by the deadline date were considered.

The applications of those listed were reviewed by the San Antonio Metropolitan Area Campaign Application Review Committee and found to meet eligibility criteria, to include the following:

- Maintain a dedicated office in the San Antonio metropolitan area open at least 30 hours per week.
- Spend at least 75 percent of monies raised locally on direct services in the San Antonio metropolitan area.
- Provide an annual audit or accountant's review.

Because of the nature of federal laws, no agency meeting established criteria could be excluded because of the kind of services it provides.

Following each agency description in this brochure, there is a percentage number. These percentages represent each agency's overhead costs.

Percentage rates alone are not the only measure of the viability or worth of the agencies in this brochure. Be assured that each of the listed agencies was deemed worthy of inclusion in this campaign by a meticulous application process.
