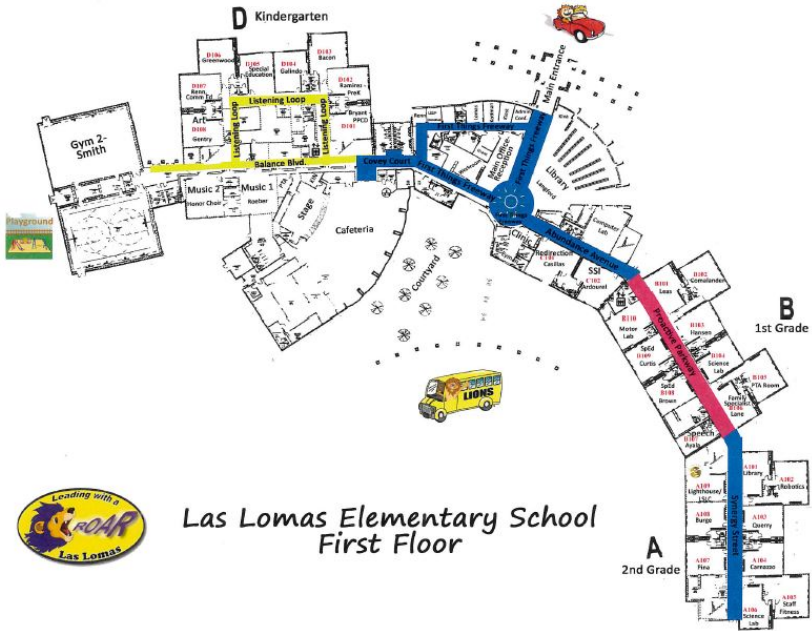

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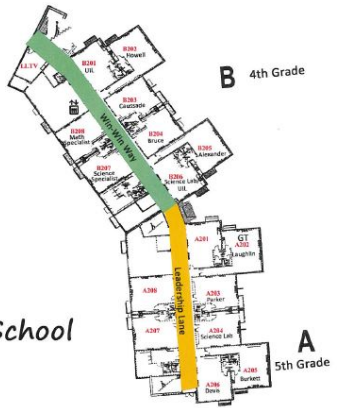
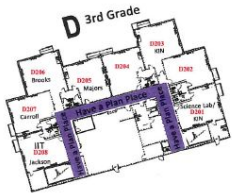
Las Lomas Elementary School First Floor

Growth Area

Using the reports from our coaching days, and reflection from our campus efforts over the past two years, our school has needed continued improvement in goal writing and tracking. It is our end-goal to focus on each child writing a goal that they understand and are able to track. This directly correlates with a school-wide goal and celebration. We also want to see progress towards that goal over the course of the year so that we may celebrate the progress as a whole school. During staff development before the 2017-2018 school year, we welcomed John Flokstra, who taught us about Wildly Important Goals and the X to Y by Z format. The 2017-2018 school year brought our first school-wide



WIG that celebrated student progress toward their individual academic goals. This included staff surveys for tracking class percentages, new ways to look at the differences between WIGs and goals, a coaching day dedicated to goals, and showed us that we needed more work in this area as a whole. We continue to work on improving the way we lead, model, write, track, and celebrate goals.

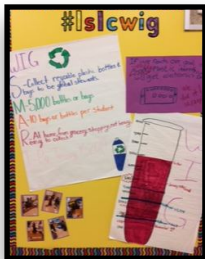


Area of Success

The automatic response from each of the Lighthouse Team members as to our most successful area was a resounding, "Active Lighthouse Teams". Our LSLC, which stands for Lion Student Leadership Committee, is a group made up of students that presented speeches in order to run for the position and were elected by their classmates to represent them as leaders of the school. Our principal, over the past three years, has really grown this group into what it is today. The LSLC has implemented a school-wide WIG and is teaching everyday about global stewardship through the goal they have chosen. As a school, we have made much growth as a Lighthouse Team. We have added two new Action Teams, we have applied to be a site visit for Symposium, we have created a Leadership Night and Leadership Scavenger Hunt for parents and students to enjoy, and we have developed a system for Action Team rotations for staff and for Lighthouse representatives. Our Active Lighthouse Teams have paved the way for the rest of our school, and we are proud to share them as our area of success.

Impact

Las Lomas has made a great effort over the past two years to understand our true impact on the world. Since our beginning, we have done a program called Ornaments for the Planet where we all get together and make Christmas Ornaments for others. Our school has also partnered with a nearby retirement home and we often make cards for the residents who now come as volunteers to read with our kiddos. Our LSLC has put our mission statement in the forefront of our minds by creating an impactful, school-wide goal for our student body. We are collecting plastic bottles and bags and properly recycling them to help save our planet. Our students are helping others learn what it means to be global stewards. The experience will start a conversation about the impact each of us have in our class, at home, in the community around us, and in the world!
